

Quarter 2 : Apr. 2023-June 2023

In April, the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness recognized the Cochrane District on reliable data for 3 consecutive months. Cochrane District is a leading community proving to others that achieving a Quality By-Name List is possible. With the Cochrane District having reliable data, it will be easier to inform improvement projects, monitor trends and advocate for resources.

The Community Homelessness Report (CHR) was submitted at the end of May. The report emphasizes the collaboration between organizations who are part of the Community Advisory Board (CAB). The CAB endeavors to have the By-Name-List as the one main point of contact for all information related to homelessness.

Care conferencing was launched in May 2023. It is a centralized process that helps community providers monitor and advance the progress of individuals towards housing.

To increase community awareness and understanding across the Cochrane District, consultant lain DeJong had numerous engagement sessions and information sessions to help build a common language and understanding of homelessness and to encourage collaboration across various providers and sectors.

Addiction & Mental Health

Quarter 2 : Apr 2023-June 2023

The Addiction and Mental Health Planning table representatives, took the opportunity on May 30, 2023, to update the City of Timmins Council members on the progress of the 19.5 million dollar request to address gaps in addiction care. Although progress has been made with Community Withdrawal, Mobile Crisis Rapid Response Team (MCRRT) and expansion of Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) services, the request in 2021 focused on 4 additional improvements that would continue to develop an inclusive system to support people with substance misuse. An educational piece was also built into the presentation with a focus on evidence based

approaches that complement the principals of the person-centered model of care.

A proposal for Intensive Complexity-Enhanced Intervention Services (Day/Evening Treatment) was sent to Ontario Health on May 26, 2023. Day/Evening Treatment services is a community-based addictions care type of treatment where people attend a program during the day. This service supports people seeking addictions care while they remain at home with family, pets, and continue to work/attend school; this treatment is an alternative to live-in treatment setting and can support people who have attended livein or inpatient addictions treatment. Intensive Day/Evening services would fill the gap between Community Based Treatment and Live-in Treatment services.

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In Quarter 2, the Adult Allies got to know youth and most importantly, the youth got to know each other. By rotating the location of the events, the Adult Allies noticed a variety of diverse youth who attended.

June 27, 2023 marked the last youth committee event until Fall. The activity took place at TH&VS gymnasium. Throughout the summer, it will be important to keep the Instagram page active and buzzing so that the City can find ways for youth to share their perspectives. It is important to engage the youth through arts, music and social media.

A funding allocation was put in place for community-led projects to combat youth crime and address knowledge gaps concerning the impacts of intervention. Seven priorities were identified and key activities will be implemented based on the consultations that were had with community partners and youth. The fund provides the Municipality with an opportunity to enhance community-based prevention and intervention strategies to tackle gun and gang activity. The following focus areas went out for tender to local youth-based agencies; a campaign and educational initiative, mentorship and research component, land-based programming enhancement, implementation of the Icelandic Prevention Model, Intervention Program and an Emerging Trends piece that places priority on newly identified patterns.
